		Grant	New & Update	<p>Publisher Partnership Workflow Program - We have begun work with 20 English language publishers to assess their workflow and make recommendations on best practices in accessibility. With 6 of these publishers, we will be working in partnership with eBOUND, as a part of a broader project for PCH (Heritage Canada). We have also begun work working with 6 French language publishers in conjunction with ANEL - this project is also funded through PCH.</p> <p>NNELS has signed consulting contracts with ACP/eBOUND for 2 pieces of work: - Landscape review landscape review on reading needs, habits and preferences of people with print disabilities in Canada, through a survey and focus groups. We have hired a consultant to help us with the survey design and focus groups. Tentative timeline will be for focus groups and survey to happen mid-January to end of February. - Review of Training Needs of Librarians on Accessibility - work will begin in on this in the New Year.</p> <p>Almost 60 invited participants have registered for the Accessibility Summit (Jan 26 & 27), and our facilitators (the same as last year) and Steering Committee are in the process of finalizing agenda. Location has been secured at the 519 in Toronto.</p> <p>VIRN has begun work on our 6 Print-Braille Titles (5 English and 1 French) that will be distributed to the provinces and territories by end of March.</p> <p>Upcoming Braille release with At Bay Press in December, and another 3 in the New Year. Also held a host library Braille call to discuss and understand needs of our host libraries and the Braille collection.</p> <p>Hired a Audiobook Recording Project Coordinator in December to help with planning and coordinating our volunteer recording program with libraries.</p> <p>With our most recent hires, we now have 18 LTE's (both fulltime and parttime) as a part of the NNELS grant staff to further our work.</p> <p>As part of our collaborative work with CELA, we did our first joint purchase this quarter with Recorded Books - over 500 titles have been added to the collection.</p> <p>Two news stories were released on NNELS.ca showcasing the composition of the Accessibility Testing team, and its great work: NNELS Accessibility Testers: The Path to Accessible Publishing, NNELS Accessibility Tests: What We Learned (X)</p> <p>Planning work continues with our partnership program with publishers. We have invited participation on 3 projects - Accessible Workflow Project, Braille Project, and the Purchasing Project with a deadline of September 30. We have had an excellent response so far. Our Braille project includes working with publishers on a simultaneous release of print titles with braille titles - 3 titles will be coming out in the fall. Our Accessible Workflow Project will pair accessibility testers with publishers to determine best practices on accessibility, and our purchasing project will add Canadian published content to the NNELS collection. (X)</p> <p>We have hired 5 additional accessibility testers, with a range of print disabilities including learning disabilities and low vision. 2 of them are also bilingual (French/English). They are from all across Canada. They have a start date of October 7. Our team now has 10 accessibility testers. (X)</p> <p>Service agreements have been signed with DAISY consortium and with VIRN. DAISY will be doing further development on the ACE checker, accessibility metadata, EPUB to DAISY format generator and training materials. VIRN will be working with us on the production of Print-Braille titles to be distributed to each of the provinces and territories. (X)</p> <p>Frankfurt Book Fair (October 2019) - Farrah Little will be representing NNELS on a panel put on by the International Convention of University Presses on Best Case - Strategies and cooperation options for making content accessible to a broader audience. (X)</p> <p>Starting in fall 2019, NNELS will receive additional funding (approximately \$200,000) from PCH/Heritage via eBOUND, ACP (Association of Canadian Publishers) and ANEL (Association nationale des éditeurs de livres) to do collaborative work in the areas of publisher accessibility education and publisher accessibility workflow. We are also engaged to do a Canadian-wide user study on the reading habits and needs of readers with print disabilities. All the projects in this bucket are also funded to provide quality employment opportunities for people with print disabilities. This work needs to be completed by March 31, 2020. (X)</p>

		Sitka Community calls	Ongoing	The Fall Sitka Business Function Group teleconference was held on November 28th, with focus on analysis of a member survey regarding Decolonizing Description in Sitka. There were 54 responses to the survey, with over 40% of respondents indicating they wanting more information to decide how to proceed, over 20% reporting that they'd already begun work on this initiative and just under 20% reporting that they were planning to proceed. 40% of respondents have worked with or have consulted with indigenous groups or community members on a wide range of initiatives (giving insight to the Sitka community's capacity to consult/seek input on description). 28 people expressed interest in serving on a committee to meet via webinar 2-3 times early in the new year, with a goal of bringing recommendations to the Sitka BFG's spring meeting.
